

Trended Fear Curves During COVID-19











The Monthly Impact Of Inflation Is Still Noticeable For Over 7 In 10 Americans


How much do you agree or disagree that rising inflation is negatively impacting your ability to afford your monthly budget?






However Now Half Of Americans Believe Inflation Will Taper Off By 2024

How likely or unlikely do you think it is that rising inflation will taper off and decrease by 2024?



Inflation Still Leads To Debt Accumulation, Reduced Savings, & The Need For **Additional Income**





How likely are you to do the following right now?


















Just Under Half Of Voters Say Their Personal Financial Situation Is Worsening

July Harvard-Harris Poll: Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?








More Americans Are Optimistic Rather Than Pessimistic About Their Lives Over The Next Year, With Pessimism Decreasing Since April









How satisfied are you with the following?



Majority Of Parents Say They Are Doing Well Across Life, Work, Parenting, Etc. But Differences Arise Between Mothers and Fathers







Americans Continue To Consider Big Personal Changes In Their Lives


In the next six months are you more likely to do any of the following because the state of the world?




How would you describe your current financial situation compared to...?





% Increased among middle-class Americans who pay for the following fixed costs

















The State Of Work: The Workplace Is Rife With Discrimination, Wage Gaps And Burnout

1 in 3

of Black and AAPI employees have experienced workplace discrimination related to their race/ethnicity.

3 in 4

of Black women agree "wage gaps are a problem in the U.S. workforce"

(v. BIPOC: 67%, AAPI: 73%, Black: 68%, White: 65%, Hispanic: 62%)

6 in 10

of Black women feel "burned out from their workplace"

(v. BIPOC: 49%, Black: 55%, AAPI: 53%, Hispanic: 47%, White: 43%)

38% of Black men report they are unable to speak out against the discrimination they experience in the workplace.


