

Americans and Billionaires Survey

Wave 2 • August 2024 • The Harris Poll Thought Leadership Practice









Methodology

This survey was conducted online within the U.S. by The Harris Poll from May 31st to June 2nd, among a nationally representative sample of 2,117 U.S. adults.

This research includes 324 Gen Z (ages 18-27), 545 Millennials (ages 28-43), 542 Gen X (ages 44-59), as well as 706 Boomers (ages 60 and older).

This report also references data from 2022 within the U.S. by The Harris Poll from July 15th to 17th, among a nationally representative sample of 1,989 U.S. adults, including 184 Gen Z, 560 Millennials, 470 Gen X, as well as 775 Boomer respondents.









Top Highlights

- Wealth gap fears increase: Americans express a growing concern of marginalization of wealth, as over seven in 10 Americans believe wealth inequality is a serious national issue. Nearly two in three Americans (64%) believe the wealth gap has grown larger compared to last year; especially BIPOC (69%) and Hispanic (74%) Americans.
- Americans are concerned over basic elements of security: Americans desire more affordable health care the most (58%), followed by affordable housing (53%), and food security (32%).
- **Billi-flation:** Despite such dreams, billionaires are blamed by most for causing hardships to the rest of society, as 58% of Americans believe the ultra-rich contribute to inflation in everyday goods and services.
- Americans want to achieve Bili-status: Six in 10 Americans (60%) want to become a billionaire one day, a sentiment most strongly felt by Millennials (73%), Hispanic Americans (71%), and Black Americans (70%).
- No wealth limits, but people are ready to tax the rich: Less than half of Americans (46%) believe there should be a limit on one's wealth. Yet many believe in taxing the rich (69%), if their tax money were to be used for national improvements.
- 'Risk it for the Biscuit' has never been more real: As six in 10 Americans seek to attain great wealth in their lifetime younger adults and minority groups in particular finding ways to make it happen is on. Americans see entrepreneurship (42%) and stock trading/investing (39%) as the fastest ways to achieve billionaire status, with three in 10 already feeling ready to say that AI is the most lucrative way to get rich fast.
- Don't Earn Like Me? Can't Burn Like Me: Americans are fed up with the double standards billionaires are allowed to have. Despite having a stronghold with funds and resources, the majority of Americans (71%) say, "Billionaires aren't doing enough with their fortunes to better our society," and think that billionaires should get out of media industries (46%) and more into humanitarianism (68%).





Achieving The Bili-Status: Americans dream of becoming a billionaire








Risk it for the biscuit - entrepreneurship is seen as the most lucrative way to become rich in America, followed by stock market trading/investing






Approximately half of Americans believe billionaires influence the economy, domestic politics, and society











What should billionaires do with their money? vs. If you were a billionaire, what would you do with your money?






Nepotism is on the agenda, billionaires from generational wealth are considered most responsible for uplifting society with good deeds




Nearly half of Americans believe there should be a wealth tax even among millionaires

If there was a proposed law taxing the extremely wealthy extensively, at what threshold do you think individuals should be taxed heavily?






Over a quarter of Americans believe wealth should be limited at even a millionaire level
